

[Please Note - Engineers call their private soldiers "Sappers", recognition of the fact that the earliest engineers had been primarily concerned with driving saps (tunnels) both towards the enemy lines and underneath fortifications].

UNITED STATES NAVY 7TH FLEET

The 7th Fleet is the largest of the US Navy's forward-deployed fleets and has 50 to 70 ships and submarines, 150 aircraft, and more than 27,000 Sailors. The fleet has been commanded by Three Star Navy Flag Officer - Vice Adm. Fred Kacher since Feb. 15, 2024.

The US Navy's 7th Fleet's area of operations spans more than 124 million square kms from the International Date Line to the India - Pakistan border; and from the Kuril Islands in the North to the Antarctic in the South. This encompasses 36 maritime countries and 50% of the world's population, including: the five largest foreign militaries: China, Russia, India, North Korea, and the Republic of Korea. The US Mutual Défense Treaty Allies are: the Philippines, Australia, the United Kingdom, the Republic of Korea, Japan and Thailand.
