

<u>Wellbeing Support Officer Activities</u> Firstly can I wish you all a very Happy New Year and I sincerely hope that 2025 continues to bring friendship, joy and continued camaraderie for the Association. 
To those who had the vision 45years ago and organised an initial meeting to see if anyone was interested, I thank you.

83rd Bangka Island Commemoration Service

On Sunday 9 February 2025. Kay, Gwenda and I attended the 83rd Bangka Island Commemoration Service at St Augustine's Anglican War Memorial Church in Hamilton, a beautiful church with the most amazing stained-glass windows.

The Service was organised and designed by Major Ann Martin (Retired) with assistance from Judith Munday OAM. It was an emotional and touching Service, a tribute to those nurses who were mercilessly gunned down by Japanese Soldiers on the beach of Bangka Island on that fateful day 83 years ago, with only one survivor Vivian Bullwinkel.

The Bangka Island Story was relayed by Major Ann Martin (Retired) followed by an Offertory Procession of the Veil and Cape to the Captives' Hymn, sung by the Brisbane Girls Grammar School Choir. A visual Roll Call remembering the Bangka Nurses was then shown.

A relative of one of the nurses was in attendance and participated in the Service as did a Board Member from the ANMC (Australian Nurses Memorial Centre) established by Vivian Bullwinkel. The Ode was given by LTCOL Maxwell Williams CO 1st Regiment Royal Australian Artillery followed by the Last Post, One Minute Silence, and Rouse. The National Anthem, Final Prayers, and Blessing concluded the Commemoration Service.

The afternoon was followed by a lovely High Tea in the Church Hall.

BUS TRIP TO GOVERNMENT HOUSE

On Tuesday the 25th February, a number of WRAAC ladies who are also members of the Defence Service Women's RSL Chapter of the Sunnybank Sub-Branch (DSWC), along with members of the WRAAF and Sunnybank RSL had the pleasure of visiting Government House (Fernberg).

We met at Sunnybank RSL before heading off to Government House by bus. Henry, our driver, took us on a short detour through Roma Street Parklands as we were running early. He entertained us with some trivia questions and jokes, whilst waiting for the gates to open when we arrived.

We were broken into three tour groups for our wandering through the grounds and the house. Our tour guide was Brendan, a very dapper young fellow, who was very knowledgeable. He answered all our questions in detail and was very enthusiastic about his role. He started the tour with a short stroll around the gardens which are beautifully maintained and very peaceful to walk through.

Having never been inside Government House, it was very interesting and educational to learn about the history and contents of the house. There were spectacular artworks, furnishings, Waterford crystal chandeliers and furniture representing many eras. It must be very impressive when the house is all lit up and the tables are fully laid with their lovely silverware and crockery for a formal function. We were privileged to have morning tea in the Drawing Room upstairs as the Investiture Room was having the parquetry flooring repolished. We were served by staff with tea or coffee and a delicious Queensland shaped biscuit, along with a selection of lamingtons and cakes from the Sunnybank RSL. The fresh floral arrangements were beautifully presented and the stained-glass window of *Robert the Bruce* was simply stunning at the top of the staircase leading to the private rooms.

Sadly, the Governor was not in residence that day as she was in India, but we did see her office.

The life size statue of Queen Elizabeth II, which was originally at the corner of George and Alice Streets in the city, now stands here proudly looking towards the city.

We were able to view the State Vehicles in their garage, but unfortunately, we were not able to have a ride! They still have the Queens Crown on the number plates, as does the household crockery, as King Charles is into sustainability and only wants change when it is really necessary.

After leaving Government House, we headed for Mount Cootha Lookout, stopping to draw the raffles along the way. After a very short visit to the lookout, we headed back to Sunnybank RSL.

A very enjoyable and enlightening day was had by all. I would encourage you to consider joining the Defence Service Women's Chapter so that you too may enjoy these great outings.
