





VALE

THELMA EILEEN SPRATLEY NEE SEENEY

28 November 1922-05 September 2023

QF270347 Gunner, Australian Women's Army Service

Thelma was born in Gayndah and enlisted in the AWAS from Monto 2 April 1943. Thelma served on Coochie Mudlow Island as a search light operator. She was discharged in Brisbane 18 July 1944 . She was entitled to wear the War Medal 1939-1945 and the Australian Service medal 1939-1945.

Thelma joined the Bundaberg & District Ex Servicewomen's Association in 1977 and again, following a break, in 2016. In 2022, Thelma became the association's third Centenarian..

OCTOBER anniversaries/significant events



There are no listed significant war history anniversaries for October, however the Australian War Memorial website: https://www.awm.gov.au/articles/atwar/oct details many noteworthy anniversaries related to WWI, WWII, Korea and Vietnam. Spread throughout the month are the names of seven Victoria Cross recipients and one George Medal winner.



3 Oct 1918 Lieutenant I. Maxwell 4 Oct1917 Sergeant | McGee 4 Oct 1917 Lance Corporal W Peeler 5 Oct 1918 Lieutenant G Ingram 12 Oct 1917 Captain C Jeffries 21-31 Oct 1942 Sergeant W H Kibby 25-26 Oct 1942 Private P E Gratwick - George Medal, 22 Oct 1946 Corporal J Sewell

The above all appear with brief detail of the awards. On the same site is a reference to 21 October 1915: 'Miss Vera Deakin, daughter of ex-Prime Minister Alfred Deakin, establishes the Australian Red Cross Missing and Wounded Enquiry Bureau in Cairo. The Missing and Wounded Enquiry Bureau handled many thousands of enquiries from Australian families seeking information on wounded and missing soldiers during the First World War.'

Moral of the story?






